A draft Strategic Plan for this Region will be circulated for your comment in the near future. It will also be sent to the UNION, Paris for their comment and hopefully approval. As you will see we look to use our wide variety of skills and goodwill which will hopefully cost little if no money.

Finally and most importantly you will be aware of the huge push in 2017-18 to gain at the UN Assembly in New York at the High Level Meeting last September, a new position and urgency for TB Elimination and fiscal support akin to that done



for HIV and other critical global issues. When we receive a formal directive from Paris we will circulate this. The hope is that as many as possible Heads of State attend in strong support and that you can help to achieve this. It will be the first communication step that we can take within our own networks.

#### **UNION APR Execom Meets with PTSI**

The Philippine Tuberculosis Society, Inc. (PTSI) is the largest private NGO and longest serving medical institution engaged in the detection, control and treatment of tuberculosis in the Philippines. It is also the Official Representative of the Philippines in the International Union Against Tuberculosis and Lung Diseases (IUATLD) and a founding member of the Philippine Coalition Against Tuberculosis (PhilCAT).

#### **PhilCAT Celebrates 25 Years**



The Philippine Coalition Against TB (PhilCAT) is a 65-member group of professional societies, government and nongovernment organizations and corporate groups with support from the Department of Health. It was formally inaugurated in 1994.

This year, PhilCAT celebrates its 25th year. It has found its niche in both local and international TB advocacy groups and for this it has been awarded and has managed internationally funded projects related to TB control. The Public-Private Mix model (PPMD) of PhilCAT was launched in 2001 and to date there have been more than 200 PPMDs established nationwide. Yearly, PhilCAT leads the World TB Day commemoration in March and holds its Annual Convention every August. In 2016, together with its member groups and other partners, PhilCAT published the evidence-based update of the Philippine TB Clinical Practice Guidelines. In

2017, the PhilCAT Convention served as the national forum for the presentation and discussion of the 2016 TB National Prevalence Survey results. Both landmark documents form the basis of the current reinvigorated and ambitious NTP program aimed to finally END TB in the country.

### Editorial

This is the maiden issue of the UNION APR Newsletter, which as mentioned by Dr. Ral Antic, aims to communicate with member-countries and to share news on what is happening in the region.

The Union, Asian Pacific Region is a multi-national not-for-profit non-governmental organization, one of 7 Regions of the International Union against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease (The Union). It is bound by and works within the Constitution of The Union and the APR Charter. The Union APR is made of up of close to 400 members, comprising 14 member countries, 15 inactive countries, two organizational members with the rest individual members. Its Officers are elected by the APR membership at the Council meeting. The members of the Union and Union APR, can participate in the activities of both. This year, the Executive Committee has had several meetings developing the Union APR Strategic Plan and organizing the 7th APR which will be held in Manila, Philippines on April 23-26, 2019. The theme is "Unity in Diversity: ONE Against TB and other Lung Diseases". The rationale: we have differences in the region- our culture, the way we approach certain diseases, local guidelines, building local coalitions and managing patients. In recognizing

this, different perspectives enable the region to potentially approach diseases in a multidimensional and collaborative manner. This makes us ONE or united in the fight to END TB.

For this conference, the Organizing Committee included other lung diseases, not just Tuberculosis. With the wealth of experts from the Region, the support of the WHO, The Union Headquarters, The Department of Health of the Philippines, Philippine Tuberculosis Society, Inc., Philippine College of Chest Physicians, CHEST Philippine Delegation, Philippine Coalition Against TB, Philippine Society of Microbiology and Infectious Disease, Philippine Pediatric Society, and Pediatric Infectious Disease Society of the Philippines, our partners in the organizing committee, we hope to come up with a world-class scientific program. The diversity in the approach to treatment and prevention of TB when shared with each other make us stronger and more effective so that at the end of the conference, we hope to strengthen and reach a common ground in this global effort to END TB.
